


My hospital: Δ Total vs. Implant \neq \$11,000 Others: Δ Total vs. Implant = \$3,000 My implant cost are reasonable compared to other hospitals?

But...my hospital's non-implant costs are much higher...Why???

Why <u>non-implant costs</u> are much higher:

- 1. Time in surgery/hospital
- 2. Ancillary materials used
- 3. Ancillary services used
- 4. Surgeon ignorance of costs

Could I be more costeffective if I knew how much things cost in the OR?


Cost of other items I usually don't care about:


